Message from the Commander

Welcome to the inaugural edition of *Transition Update*! As we continue on this journey of historic change within the Military Health System (MHS), consistent communication is incredibly important, and I will do everything I can to keep you informed along the way.

As I have said many times, transparency is a top priority for me, and I am committed to telling you what I know—and what I don't know, which is often the most challenging part. As we have seen, plans can change day by day—and sometimes minute by minute, so it can be difficult to stay abreast of progress as it happens. This high level of fluidity is precisely why I'm introducing the

Transition Update. It will be published regularly and as needed to ensure you have the latest information as soon it becomes available. Keep an eye on your inbox for future editions!

I also want to thank everyone who attended the town halls last week. We had a great turnout, and I truly appreciate your time and input. As discussed, the Air Force Medical Readiness Agency (AFMRA) is projected to stand up at initial operational capability (IOC) on 1 Jul 19. At IOC, the Air Force Medical Support Agency (AFMSA) will be deactivated, while AFMOA will be re-designated and re-focused for the readiness mission. The AFMRA commander will also be named and in place at the Defense Health Headquarters (DHHQ) in Falls Church; all other staff will remain in place. Over the following year and a half, AFMRA will continue to grow and solidify until 1 Oct 20, when we expect it to reach full operational capability (FOC). As always, plans can change at any moment, but this is our path as of today.

As AFMRA develops to FOC, the Defense Health Agency (DHA) will continue to ramp up responsibility for the management and administration of all Military Treatment Facilities (MTFs) worldwide. The most

recent timeline shows DHA at full force on 1 Oct 21; however, signs from higher headquarters point to accelerating the timeline to culminate in fiscal year 2020.

DHA's plan for MTF management and administration currently centers on a regional model, covering catchment areas around multiservice markets and designated MTFs. Facilities that don't fit neatly into a catchment area will be managed by a DHA Market Development Office (MDO) dedicated solely to stand-alone MTFs. Recognizing the outstanding capabilities already in place at AFMOA, DHA is partnering with us on a proposal to open the office right here in San Antonio; the proposal should go before MHS governance in the coming months. My hope is that many of our talented AFMOA personnel will be able to transition to the MDO, if the San Antonio plan is approved. I will provide an update as soon as possible, so stay tuned.



- The Air Force will continue to manage health care for mission readiness—ensuring both a medically ready force and a ready medical force to win any fight, any time

AFMRA Standup Timeline



- ★ 1 Jul 2019 | AFMRA IOC
 - AFMSA/AFMOA are rebranded/renamed
 - Commander is named and in place at DHHQ
 - All other staff remain in their current locations
 - Two vice commanders (one in San Antonio and one in Falls Church) and support staff are identified
 - Directors are named and begin shaping their staff
 - Passcode is established
 - Staff realignment begins
- ★ 1 Oct 2020 | AFMRA FOC
 - All functions are fully established
 - Through 1 Oct 2021:
 - AFMSA / AFMOA will be fully absorbed
 - All personnel actions will be completed
 - Active Duty, Civilian, and Contractor issues will be resolved
 - All contracts will be realigned
